

ITINERARY



August 9 - Depart USA

Your journey begins as you depart the USA.

August 10 - Stockholm, Sweden

Arrive in Stockholm today and make your way to the port to board the lovely Azamara Journey.

August 11 - Tallinn, Estonia

Tallinn's fairy-tale castles, cobble streets and warm hospitality remain one of Europe's best-kept secrets. Head to the city's Old Town, where you can see medieval Raekoja Plats (Town Hall Square) and wander hidden passageways between 17th- and 18th-century earthwork forts. Tour the ornate Orthodox Cathedral of St. Alexander Nevsky, full of detailed mosaics and traditional icons. Take a foray to the unspoiled Baltic coastline just outside Tallinn — check out popular Piritu or quiet Kakumae. Later, stop into one of Tallinn's iconic cellar restaurants to fuel up on hearty Estonian fare like mulgipuder, a porridge of barley and potatoes flavored with smoky bacon.

August 12 & 13 - St. Petersburg, Russia

Since its founding by Peter the Great in 1703, St. Petersburg has been one of the most impressive cities in Russia, Europe and the world. Marvel at the Baroque and neoclassical architecture on display within its UNESCO World Heritage historical center. Enjoy the relaxing charm of the Baltic Sea as you stroll along it. Cruise to St. Petersburg and hop on a boat and see the colorful variety of the city's sights and architecture on a canal tour. Or spend the day meandering the action-packed 3.5-mile stretch of Nevsky Prospect, where you'll find the can't-miss Cathedral of Our Lady of Kazan and plenty of cafes where you can fuel up on cured sausage and thick rye bread.

August 14 - Helsinki, Finland

There's no shortage of things to do and see in this stylish historical capital. After you've explored Helsinki's center, head to Punavuori, with its Design District, the superb Design Museum and many attractive shops and galleries. Join the Finns for a sauna, or relax in a trendy cafe in the Kallio district, which has recently undergone a facelift. You can also take a ferry 15 minutes to the fortress of Suomenlinna, a UNESCO World Heritage Site and one of Finland's most popular sights. Visit the museums, bunkers and fortress walls, built by the Swedes in the 18th century. Then, enjoy a picnic and hike along the cluster of car-free islands that are all connected by walking bridges.

August 15 - Visby, Gotland, Sweden

A small town on the island of Gotland in the Baltic Sea, Visby was a popular trading spot during the Viking Age. Today, it's Sweden's sunniest vacation destination and a UNESCO World Heritage site. Explore the 3.5 km Ringmuren (Ring Wall), built in the 13th Century, and see its 50 towers and surrounding moats. Snap shots of the idyllic red rose-covered cottages, the ruined Gothic churches and the 13th-century Saint Maria Cathedral. If you'd like to know more about the island's history, don't miss the excellent Gotland Museum. Cruise to Visby and head 20 kilometers south to the Tofta Viking Village, a Viking-era settlement reconstructed around authentic ancient monuments.

August 16 - Copenhagen, Denmark

Today you can explore Copenhagen and journey into the heart of the Danish capital, full of historical buildings and ancient streets. Popular sights are the Little Mermaid statue, the Gefion fountain, the Royal residence Amalienborg Palace and the Nyhavn Canal with its charming outdoor restaurants and picturesque cafés, the Christiansborg Castle, the home of the Danish Parliament, the Royal Opera House, and many more sights. You may also choose to take a canal cruise around the city to see the Northern Capital from a totally different side.

August 17 - Return to USA



Make your way to the Copenhagen airport this morning and start your journey home.

August 8 - Depart USA

August 9 - Arrive in Stockholm and be greeted by our representatives. Board your bus and visit Drottningholm Palace, where the Swedish royal family lives. Enjoy a walking tour of Gamla Stan (the old town in Swedish), one of the many islands that form Stockholm. The island was originally settled in the 13th century and is home to the stock exchange, Nobel Museum, Stockholm Cathedral, House of Nobility, and the Royal Palace. Have free time to enjoy the medieval streets and many shops before proceeding to your hotel for dinner and overnight. (L, D)

August 10 - This morning visit the Vasa Museum, home of the almost fully intact Vasa warship which sank on its maiden voyage in 1628. Enjoy a panoramic tour of Stockholm before proceeding to the port to embark on the Azamara Journey. Lunch will be on-board today. (B, L, D)



COPENHAGEN POST-TOUR

August 17 - Disembark this morning and continue to Frederiksborg Castle. This impressive and unrivalled Renaissance castle was built in the first decades of the 17th century by the legendary Danish King Christian IV and incorporates the best of Renaissance architecture and craftsmanship. Continue to the impressive Kronburg Castle, one of the most important Renaissance castles in northern Europe and UNESCO World Heritage site. For centuries, the castle served as a fortification guarding one of the few entrances to the Baltic Sea. More notably, the castle was also the setting of Shakespeare's tragedy, Hamlet. In the afternoon, return to Copenhagen for free time to enjoy lunch and explore other notable sites in Copenhagen like Tivoli Gardens. Dinner and overnight in Copenhagen. (B, L, D)

August 18 - Transfer to the airport for your return flight to the USA.

FIT TO TRAVEL STATEMENT:

Passengers registering for the tour accept the responsibility for being in good health and able to walk and travel on the cruise. The cruise ships can be quite large and require lots of walking onboard. Because many of the sites visited on shore excursions are not accessible to the physically challenged, those needing oxygen, wheelchairs, or other ambulatory assistance will find the cruise extremely limiting to their experiences.

PASSPORT INFORMATION, CONFIRMATION OF ITINERARY & CHECK IN PROCESS:

Passport information must be submitted to our office by 06/20/19. Failure to provide your passport information to our office by this date may result in change fees or denial of travel. 50 days prior to your trip you will be contacted to re-confirm your itinerary, travel arrangements and registration information during the preliminary check in process for your trip. Discrepancies in information or failure to check in for your cruise may result in change fees, delays in receiving travel documents for your trip, or denial of travel.

PRICE INCREASES:

All prices quoted in this brochure are subject to change prior to payment in full due to cabin availability changes, currency fluctuations, fuel surcharge increases, government taxes and fees increases or unforeseen circumstances. In addition, you may be subject to a price increase after payment in full has been received due to potential government imposed taxes and fees.

AIRLINE ROUTES and TICKETS:

In order to keep prices low, ETS does not guarantee the most direct routing to your final destination. Once "printed", airline tickets cannot be changed or refunded thereafter. Air transportation to/from your destination will be economy class on IATA and ARC carriers utilizing APEX or SUPER APEX non-refundable, non-amendable tickets for groups of 10 or more flying together on entire itinerary. If you choose to depart from a different city than your group or travelling companion, or deviate your flight and/or trip plans, and/or you are taking a pre or post tour, you may fly on a different scheduled flight(s) than the rest of your group.

FLIGHT TIMES:
