OCTOBER 17: DEPART USA

Depart the USA on your overnight flight to Geneva

OCTOBER 18: ARRIVE IN GENEVA

Arrive in Geneva and check in to your hotel for dinner and overnight.

OCTOBER 19: GENEVA

Geneva was the center of the Swiss Reformation movement with John Calvin as its chief theologian. We will begin the day by visiting St. Peter's Cathedral where Calvin taught the Reformed doctrine. You can see Calvin's chair and climb 157 steps up to the top of the North Tower, where the view is worth the effort! Under the Cathedral are the ruins of a Roman sanctuary, a 4th century basilica and a 6th century church! Calvin's Academy is near by and is also called The Protestant Lecture Hall. John Knox also taught here for three years. Next we see the Reformation Monument which was constructed between 1909 to 1917. This impressive monument is also referred to as the "Protestant Rome!" The giant wall is 325 feet long and 30 feet high and displays 15 foot tall statues of four Geneva Reformation leaders: Guillaume Farel, John Calvin, Theodore Beza and John Knox. Spend the afternoon shopping or relaxing by the lake. Overnight in Geneva.

OCTOBER 20: GENEVA to ZURICH

We depart very early for Zurich, a beautiful city filled with history and ambience, framed by the breathtaking Alps. Zurich was at the center of the Swiss Reformation in the 16th century under the leadership of Ulrich Zwingli. Visit the Grossmünster Church, the mother church of the Reformation in Switzerland where Zwingli began teaching his Reform theologies that led to Zurich's freedom from Rome's control. Also see the Helferei where Zwingli lived. We will visit the shore of the Limmat river where the Anabaptists were drowned. Dinner & overnight in Zurich.

OCTOBER 21: ZURICH to BASEL

Enjoy a free morning at your hotel in Zurich before driving to Basel to embark on your journey up the Rhine river.

Guests taking an extension may be on a different flight than their group and/or traveling companion.

ITINERARY

Grand cities blend in perfect harmony with their historic past and their progressive future. Zurich's medieval houses, narrow lanes and town halls from the Renaissance period offer a striking backdrop to its trendy and ultra-modern metropolis. And Amsterdam's Golden Age melds seamlessly with its lively cafés, exciting nightlife and glorious museums. Inspirational towns have given way to great stories, poetry and music—Heidelberg, where Mark Twain wrote "A Tramp Abroad." Timeless traditions remain intact—from the making of Kölsch, Cologne's legendary brew to the making of Rüdeshheimer Coffee. Take a front-row seat on an enchanting journey that takes you along the Rhine and through its designated-UNESCO World Heritage Site with its 40 castles strung like pearls on its river banks and to magnificent cities and charming villages alike.

OCTOBER 20: DEPART USA

Board your overnight flight to Switzerland.

OCTOBER 21: ARRIVE IN ZURICH - EMBARKATION IN BASEL

Arrive in Zurich today and enjoy a brief city tour and talk about the Reformation in Switzerland before transferring to Basel. Embark the ship this afternoon. Tonight, gather on board and meet your fellow passengers. (D)

OCTOBER 22: BREISACH

Breisach is your gateway to several different excursions, depending on your interests. Step back in time with a visit to the enchanting Alsatian town of Riquewihr, which looks almost the same as it did in the 16th century. On your walking tour, admire historic architecture as well as famous sights, such as the Dolder Gate. Alternatively, you may wish to go to Freiburg, founded in 1120 and home to the Freiburg's Münster, a Gothic cathedral said to have "the most beautiful spire on earth." Those wishing a more active excursion can cycle through the scenic countryside; or go to the Black Forest, a magical land full of cultural traditions, as well as home to elaborate cuckoo clocks, striking half-timber houses, ruined castles and quaint towns. (B,L,D)

OCTOBER 23: STRASBOURG

Strasbourg, the capital city of Alsace, offers flavors of both France and Germany because of its borderline location. Enjoy a panoramic tour past the stunning Parc de l'Orangerie, the European Parliament and the Place de la République. Then walk through its iconic UNESCO World Heritage "La Petite France" district, which appears to have been lifted straight from the pages of a fairytale. Wander through these charming streets and past the Cathédrale de Notre Dame with its famous astronomical clock. (B,L,D)

OCTOBER 24: LUDWIGSHAFEN - RÜDESHEIM (ETS EXCLUSIVE EXCURSION)

From Ludwigshafen journey to Worms. Explore the ancient city of Worms, site of the famous Diet of Worms where Luther refused to back down from his criticism of the church. The city's Reformation Monument features statues of major figures in the Reformation. Later in the day, sail to Rüdeshheim where you can visit Siegfried's Mechanical Music Museum; or taste one of the town's special delights, Rüdeshheimer Coffee, ceremoniously made with brandy. (B,L,D)

OCTOBER 25: RÜDESHEIM - RHINE GORGE (ETS EXCLUSIVE EXCURSION)

Travel from Rüdeshiem to visit the Rhine River city of Mainz where Johann Gutenberg developed the processes of moveable type which permitted printing to be done on a production scale. It was an essential tool which made the Reformation possible for it allowed the words of the reformers to be distributed to the masses. During the afternoon, set sail along the scenic Rhine River Gorge with its fabled legends and many castles to Lahnstein where you'll enjoy an exclusive festive celebration. (B,L,D)

OCTOBER 26: COLOGNE

Home to one of Germany's most revered Gothic masterpieces, the Cologne Cathedral, this 2,000 year-old city is also a bustling cosmopolitan hotspot. Join a guided tour through the enchanting Old Town and explore the UNESCO-designated cathedral, where the remains of the fabled Three Kings—the Magi—are believed to rest. Alternatively, ride a bike along the Rhine and through the historic Stadtpark; or visit a local tavern to taste Kölsch beer and Reibekuchen—potato pancakes served with apple sauce. (B,L,D)


OCTOBER 27: AMSTERDAM

Eclectic Amsterdam boasts amazing history, art, architecture, and museums, and you have a choice as to how you wish to explore it. The famous canals of Amsterdam await discovery on your city tour beginning with a scenic canal cruise followed by a walk to Begijnhof, known for its Middle Age buildings. For a different view of the city, you can join the Jewish Heritage tour begins with a visit to the 17th-century Portuguese Synagogue and the Jewish Historical Museum chronicling the history of the Jews in Amsterdam. OCTOBER 29: BERLIN TOUR & OVERNIGHT

Drive to Berlin this morning. Our visit will begin with a city tour that showcases the three centers of Berlin: the west around Kurfuerstendamm Boulevard and the Memorial Church, then we visit the new center around Potsdamer Square and finally the eastern section around Unter Den Linden, the Brandenburg Gate and Alexanderplatz. Check in to your hotel in Berlin for dinner and overnight.

OCTOBER 30: BERLIN TOUR & OVERNIGHT

What other city in Europe has changed over the last ten years as much as Berlin? Our tour of this once divided metropolis includes the restored Reichstag, the monumental Brandenburg Gate, Charlotten Palace, the 210-foot Victory Column in the vast Tiergarten Park and a visit to the Kaiser Wilhelm Memorial Church. Visit the Pergamon Museum, one of the five wonderful museums that sit on Berlin's Museum Island. The Pergamon Museum is divided into three distinct sections: the Antiquity Collection, the Islamic Art Museum, and the Near East Museum. Return to your hotel in Berlin for dinner & overnight.

OCTOBER 26: DISEMBARK IN COLOGNE

Home to one of Germany's most revered Gothic masterpieces, the Cologne Cathedral, this 2,000 year-old city is also a bustling cosmopolitan hotspot. Join a guided tour through the enchanting Old Town and explore the UNESCO-designated cathedral, where the remains of the fabled Three Kings—the Magi—are believed to rest. Learn about Cologne's Jewish history today as you wander through the town. Drive to Erfurt for dinner & Overnight

OCTOBER 27: ERFURT & EISLEBEN

Our journey continues as we explore Eisleben, situated in the countryside of the Harz mountains. Luther was born and baptized in Eisleben and also died there. Visit his house where he was born and died. Continue on to Erfurt, the spiritual home of Martin Luther. Sights include a visit to the Augustinian Monastery where Luther served as a monk. We will also visit the Franciscan church where Luther preached in 1529 and St. Mary's Church where he was ordained as a priest. Visit the Luther House where Luther was educated from 1498-1501. Continue to the Wartburg Castle, where Luther took shelter from the wrath of the Pope and translated the New Testament from Greek to German.

OCTOBER 28: WITTENBERG & OVERNIGHT

Today's journey in Wittenberg recalls the life and work of Martin Luther. See the gates of the Schlosskirche (Castle Church) where he nailed his 95 Theses in 1517 challenging the Catholic Church, then visit the Stadtkirche (City Church) where Luther and his associates preached the gospel to the common people. Take advantage of buying your lunch of bratwurst or weiner-schnitzel in the town square dominated by the monuments of Luther and Melancthon. We will visit the Lutherhalle, an important museum located in the Augustinian monastery in which Luther lived, first as a monk and later as owner with his wife Katharina von Bora and family. Lutherhalle's collection of objects related to the history of the German Reformation include Luther's own desk, the pulpit from which he preached at the Stadtkirche, his teaching robe, and first editions of his books. Return to your hotel in Wittenberg for dinner & overnight.

Similarly without limiting the foregoing, passenger agrees to hold us harmless for any defect in any vehicle, plane, boat, bus, car, van or other vehicle, act of war or insurrection, terrorist activity, revolt or other civil uprising, military action, strikes or labor unrest or any Act of God or for any other act of any third party.
