



Haiti Missions Experience

September 22-29, 2020





Sept. 22 (Tuesday) – Depart USA and arrive in Port Au Prince.

Upon arrival you will be met by a Mission of Grace representative who will direct you to your bus and transfer. From the airport, you will make your way to the Resort and Mission of Grace Center for a ministry orientation. After orientation, you will have dinner and check in to your hotel.

Sept. 23 (Wednesday) – Missions Activities

Your Missions activities start today! Enjoy breakfast at the resort, then from the hotel you will make a short walk to the Mission of Grace Orphanage Center. More than 60 children ranging in age from 1-16 years old live here. Many individuals come to serve within our orphanage leading activities and doing crafts with our children, as well as serve alongside our full-time nannies. Be a part of writing a new future for them; a future in which they know they are accepted by a God who loves them and has a great plan for their lives. All of your meals for the day will be provided by the resort.

Sept. 24 (Thursday) – Missions Activities / Tour Optional Museum Musee du Pantheon

Enjoy breakfast at the resort, continue your work in the Orphanage, and following lunch at the resort, you can enjoy an optional tour to the Museum Musee du Pantheon (additional \$40 per person). The Museum features the heroes of the independence and the Haitian history and culture, heroes such as “Silver Gun” and the bell used to announce the independence. It also contains various exhibits of slavery, sculptures and temporary exhibitions of paintings. Return in time for dinner at the resort and retire for the evening.

Sept. 25 (Friday) – Missions Activities / Tour Optional Bassin Bleu

Enjoy breakfast at the resort, then continue with your Missions activities by working with the elderly home in the morning that is a short walk from the resort. Home of Grace was once the first ministry and moved to their new permanent home in April, 2016. We have men and women with varying degrees of health and ability who receive full-time quality care. Spend your time doing physiotherapy and crafts. The most vulnerable in any society are the young, the sick, and the elderly. Haiti is no exception. There are many elderly and disabled citizens who require love and compassion, as well as physical assistance, yet there are few institutions or organizations that meet these needs. Home of Grace is a home where the elderly or ill are cared for and fed on a daily basis by five full-time caregivers. In the afternoon following your lunch at the resort, you can enjoy an optional tour where you can visit Bassin Bleu (additional \$30 per person). Tucked into the mountains 12km northwest of Jacmel, Bassin Bleu is a series of three cobalt-blue pools linked by waterfalls that make up one of the prettiest swimming holes in Haiti where kids often jump from high rocks. Return in time for dinner at the resort and retire for the evening.

Sept. 26 (Saturday) – Mission Activities

Enjoy breakfast at the resort, continue with your Missions activities by working with the elderly home in the morning or Orphanage of Grace.

You can even ask about other serving opportunities that you can serve in:

Grace Community School

Grace Community School exists to raise the next generation of Haitian leaders by pursuing excellence in academics, practical skills, integrity, and moral values. The goal is that each one will become a responsible Christian and productive citizen. There are currently over 250 students in preschool through eighth grade.

Men of Grace

The goal of this program is to support up to 24 young men—providing housing, meals, vocational skills training, discipleship, English language instruction, education and training in basic business and personal finance. We will also provide mentorship and a support system designed to connect participants with their community for business networking opportunities and to give back once they are more established.

Grace Girls Home

In 2015 we were able to open an extension to our orphanage for young girls. We have sixteen girls, ages 17-24, who are in a vital and vulnerable stage of life, and we are so thankful that they have a safe place to call home where they are free to be who they are. They have a devoted house mother to love on them and guide them through these challenging years, and help them to grow into young women that know and love God and others.

The Soup Kitchen

In a community where it is more common to be unemployed than to have a steady income, hunger is a real and constant need the people here face. We truly believe that in order to reach the hearts and minds of those we serve, we must also be faithful to meet the tangible, physical needs they face daily. Our soup kitchen was opened in December 2015, and we are feeding 200 people per day, 7 days per week.

Grace Community Clinic

The lack of first aid and hospital care were once very apparent in Carries. By building a properly resourced clinic, including two doctors, four trained nurses and a pharmacy, we have provided the community a clean and safe place to receive much needed medical care and education. ***Must be a health care professional***

Children of Grace Orphanage

We provide housing, food, clothing, medical care, and schooling for more than 85 children. Some of our children have lost their parents, while others have been abandoned by families unable to care for them. We desire to be a part of writing a new future for them; a future in which they know they are accepted by a God who loves them and has a great plan for their lives.

Home of Grace

The most vulnerable in any society are the young, the sick, and the elderly. Haiti is no exception. There are many elderly and disabled citizens who require love and compassion, as well as physical assistance, yet there are few institutions or organizations that meet these needs. Home of Grace is a home where the elderly or ill are cared for and fed on a daily basis by five full-time caregivers.

Grace Community Church

Over 200 people pack the church building each Sunday as we gather to worship God and hear from His word. Throughout the week we conduct Bible studies, and a number of our pastors and members travel throughout the village and the mountain sharing the love of Jesus through prayer, evangelism, and often some much needed food.

Itinerary continued...

Sept. 27 (Sunday) – Morning Worship at a local Church in Haiti

Enjoy breakfast at the resort. This morning you will have the unique experience of attending a worship service with a local congregation. Church in Haiti is very important and people wear their best clothes each Sunday. Over 200 people pack the church building each Sunday as we gather to worship God and hear from His word. Throughout the week we conduct Bible studies, and a number of our pastors and members travel throughout the village and the mountain sharing the love of Jesus through prayer, evangelism, and often some much needed food. We ask that women wear a dress or a knee-length skirt and a blouse or shirt that has sleeves (no tank tops). For men, we ask you to wear long pants and a collared shirt. In the afternoon following lunch at the resort, take time to enjoy the private beach and pool at the resort. Take time to enjoy a glass bottom boat tour (provided by the resort). If you are in the mood for some excitement, rent a jet ski (provided by the resort). All of these options are services provided by the resort, and payment and pricing are all done by the resort. Enjoy dinner at the resort to conclude your Sunday.

Sept. 28 (Monday) – Missions Activities / Optional Tour of Palace of Sans Souci

Enjoy breakfast at the resort. Your Missions activities will continue by serving in one of the provided missions. In the afternoon following lunch at the resort, you can enjoy an optional tour where you can visit the Palace of Sans Souci (additional \$40). The majestic ruins of the Palace of Sans Souci stand amid verdant mountains in the north of Haiti. The site evokes the reign of King Henri I, known as King Henri Christophe, who was instrumental in the Haitian Revolution that won independence from France in 1804. This architectural complex was completed in 1813 as the residence and administrative center of King Henri. Return in time for dinner at the resort and retire for the evening.

Sept. 29 (Tuesday) – Return to USA

Today you will say farewell to Mission of Grace and Haiti as you return home with many wonderful memories and stories to share.

ACCOMMODATIONS:

Price is per person based on double occupancy. When available, single rooms are often smaller than doubles. While we will try to match roommates, we cannot guarantee a roommate will be available. Roommates may be assigned as late as 30 days prior to departure and, if one is not available or you request a single room, the following charges apply: \$398 during the basic week.

REGISTRATIONS RECEIVED after June 9, 2020:

We welcome registrations after 06/09/20. Registrations received between 06/10/20 - 06/24/20 will incur a \$100 per person fee. Registrations received between 06/25/20 - 07/09/20 will incur a \$200 per person fee. Registrations received on 07/10/20 or later will incur an additional fee based on air availability. Additional fees will be advised upon registration.

CANCELLATION FEES:

100% of Cancellation Fees are covered by the optional Travel Protection Program, provided premium has been paid and reason for cancellation is coverable. Those who do not take travel protection should be aware of the following cancellation penalties: From day of registration to 76 days prior to departure, you will be charged the \$100 non-refundable administrative fee plus any airline fees. Additionally, thereafter, you will be charged any airline penalties and a single room supplement if your cancellation forces your roommate into a single plus the following charges: 75-60 days = \$400; 59-45 days = \$600; 44-31 days = 40% of total cost; 30 days to day of departure = 100% of total cost. Submit cancellation in writing. On or after day of departure, there will be no refund for any services not used.

FIT TO TRAVEL STATEMENT:

Passengers registering for the tour accept the responsibility for being in good health and able to walk and travel on the tour. Those needing oxygen, wheelchairs, or other ambulatory assistance may find certain aspects of this tour extremely limiting to their experiences.

Photo copies of the passport must be submitted to our office no later than 06/09/20 Failure to provide your passport information to our office by this date will result in change fees or denial of travel. Discrepancies in information or failure to check in for your tour may result in change fees, delays in receiving travel documents for your trip, or denial of travel. Passports must be valid for at least 6 months after the return date.

PRICE INCREASES:

All prices quoted in this brochure are subject to change prior to payment in full due to currency fluctuations, fuel surcharge increases, government taxes and fees increases or unforeseen circumstances. In addition, you may be subject to a price increase after payment in full has been received due to potential government imposed taxes and fees.

ITINERARY CHANGES:

Every effort has been made to ensure the accuracy of this brochure. While you will see all sites listed in this brochure, the order of sites and/or days and number of days may be altered to accommodate changes in airline, hotel schedules, and local conditions.
