BIO: THE REV. DR. PETER WALKER

The Rev. Dr. Peter Walker first visited the Holy Land in 1981 and has been leading tours on a regular basis since 1984—tours for clergy, students, and

lay people, tours for people from every continent. Peter has written numerous books, including popular-level books In the Steps of Jesus, The Story of the Holy Land, and In the Steps of Saint Paul. He is a graduate of Oxford and Cambridge and has taught at Wycliffe Hall, Oxford.

ITINERARY

WEDNESDAY, JANUARY 3: DEPART THE USA

We are on our way to the Holy Land!

THURSDAY, JANUARY 4: ARRIVAL IN ISRAEL AND CAESAREA MARITIMA

We land before noon and are met at Ben Gurion airport by our guide. Our first visit is right by the sea, walking around the ancient ruins of Caesarea Maritima, built by Herod the Great. We see its harbor, aqueduct, and theatre, as well as Herod's Palace where later St Paul would be kept under house arrest for two years (Acts 23-26). Check into our hotel in Tiberias (U Boutique or similar), where we will stay for two nights.

FRIDAY, JANUARY 5: NAZARETH

We spend our first morning in Nazareth. We visit Mary's Well, the site of the town's fountain where Mary would often have gone to draw water. Nearby is the Greek Orthodox church of St. Gabriel with its many icons. From there, we walk to the Latin church of the Annunciation, the traditional site of Mary's childhood home and of the Angel Gabriel's appearance to her. After lunch, we visit the rounded hilltop of Mount Tabor, the traditional site for the Transfiguration. Dinner is at our hotel.

SATURDAY, JANUARY 6: FROM GALILEE TO JERUSALEM

This morning, we will enjoy being around the Sea of Galilee. First, we stop by the Jordan River for the renewal of our baptismal vows. Then, we take a boat ride on the Sea of Galilee before entering Capernaum to see the ancient synagogue and St. Peter's house. We continue to the Mount of Beatitudes and visit the lakeside sites in Tabgha—the Loaves and Fishes church and the chapel of St. Peter's Primacy. We will also ensure time to celebrate Holy Communion together. We then drive south to Jerusalem and visit the Israel Museum before checking into the luxury American Colony Hotel.

SUNDAY, JANUARY 7: BETHLEHEM

Today, we enjoy going to Bethlehem. As we go in, we cannot but notice the large wall, especially near Rachel's Tomb, that now separates the area of Bethlehem from Jerusalem. Down below the town is the area of Beit Sahour (Shepherds' Field), where we have an opportunity to see some of the caves in which the shepherds might have stayed when they were "out in the field, keeping watch over their flock by night" (Luke 2). We then go up to Manger Square. From here we go into the Church of the Nativity and down the steps into the Grotto of the Nativity, the traditional site for Jesus' birthplace. Dinner and overnight are at our hotel.

MONDAY, JANUARY 8: JERUSALEM

We depart for the Western Wall, a central site within Judaism, located just below the Haram al-Sharif (the Muslim sanctuary with the Dome of The Rock and the Al-Aqsa Mosque). We walk through the Old City streets to St. Anne's church by the Pool of Bethesda. After lunch, we walk down from the Mount of Olives, following the traditional route of the Palm Sunday Procession: we stop at the churches of the 'Pater Noster' and 'Dominus Flevit', where 'the Lord wept' over the city (Luke 19) and walk to the Garden of Gethsemane to visit the Church of All Nations. Our final visit is to the church at the center of Christendom, the Church of the Holy Sepulchre, also known as the Church of the Resurrection, which marks the traditional site for Golgotha and the empty tomb of Jesus. Dinner and overnight at our hotel.

TUESDAY, JANUARY 9: THE JUDEAN DESERT, JERICHO AND THE DEAD SEA

Today has a very different feel as we escape into the wilderness of Judea, stopping in the Wadi Qelt to experience the desert's early morning silence and then going down to the Jordan Valley to hike up the Mount of Temptation from where we have panoramic views over Jericho. In the afternoon, we visit Qumran, famous for the discovery of the Dead Sea Scrolls, and close our day by swimming in—or really floating on—the Dead Sea!

WEDNESDAY, JANUARY 10: THE WAY OF THE CROSS AND EMMAUS

Early this morning, we will walk along the Via Dolorosa, praying together the Way of the Cross. We return to our hotel for breakfast and then visit the Princess Basma Center. We then continue driving westwards from Jerusalem, past some of the sites associated with the story of Emmaus (Luke 24). Finally, we drive to the beautiful harbor town of Jaffa (ancient Joppa) before heading to Tel Aviv airport for our journey home.



SATURDAY, DECEMBER 30: DEPART THE USA

SUNDAY, DECEMBER 31: ARRIVAL IN AMMAN

After landing in Amman, we will be met by the local representative and transferred to our hotel in Amman for dinner and overnight.

MONDAY, JANUARY 1: AMMAN AND BETHANY BEYOND THE JORDAN

On our first day, we tour the city of Amman, seeing its citadel, the Archaeological Museum, and the Roman Theatre. We then drive down into the Jordan Rift Valley and visit the recently discovered site of "Bethany Beyond the Jordan" (John 1:28), where John may have baptized Jesus. In the mid-afternoon, we drive southward to Wadi Rum and settle into our Bedouin camp for a BBQ dinner and overnight in a Bedouin tent.

TUESDAY, JANUARY 2: WADI RUM AND LITTLE PETRA

The landscape of Wadi Rum (the 'Valley of the Moon') with its immensity, color and awe-inspiring shapes can create an almost supernatural atmosphere. It was the setting for the 1962 film Lawrence of Arabia, and the actual location where T.E. Lawrence set up his camp; his book The Seven Pillars of Wisdom (1926) was named after the seven natural columns that can be seen as we approach the wadi. We will explore the desert in 4x4 vehicles, driven by local Bedouins, and experience the hospitality for which Bedouins are so famous. Some of us may opt, for an additional fee, to go on a camel ride! Then, in the afternoon we set off northwards, stopping briefly (if time permits) in Siq Al-Barid ('Little Petra') before arriving in Petra, where we check into our hotel for dinner and overnight.

WEDNESDAY, JANUARY 3: PETRA

Today is our day to explore the unique city of Petra (the 'rose-red city half as old as time'). The only way into this extraordinary rock-cut city is through a long, narrow gorge (known as the Siq), which can only be accessed by golf cart, horseback, or on foot. The first thing we see—standing directly in front of us as we emerge from the Siq—is the vast façade of the Treasury (Al-Khazneh), built in the first century AD. We have several hours to wander further into the city, enjoying the intricate detail of the many monuments carved into the cliffsides of rose-colored rock. We return to our hotel in Petra for dinner and overnight.

THURSDAY, JANUARY 4: FROM JORDAN TO ISRAEL

This morning, we visit Mount Nebo, where Moses caught a glimpse of the Promised Land (Deut. 34). On a clear day it is possible to see all the way across the Jordan Valley to the rooftops of Jerusalem. We then travel north to the spectacular ancient city of Jerash, one of the bestpreserved Roman cities in the world. We enjoy strolling through the famous oval piazza, wandering along the many colonnaded streets, and standing in the grand theatre. We then continue our journey, crossing the international border and journeying on to Tiberias, where we meet the rest of our fellow pilgrims at our hotel (U Boutique or similar).

Additional fees will be advised upon registration.

CANCELLATION FEES:

100% of Cancellation Fees are covered by the optional Travel Protection Program, provided premium has been paid and reason for cancellation is coverable. Those who do not take travel protection should be aware of the following per-person cancellation penalties: From day of registration to 105 days prior to departure, you will be charged the \$200 non-refundable cancellation fee.
