












REV. DR. BRIAN KNESER

OCTOBER 12: DEPART THE USA

Board your overnight flight to Zurich.

OCTOBER 13: ZURICH

Arrive in Zurich and check into your hotel.

Zurich seamlessly blends its historic past with its progressive future, all of which will be on full display during your city tour. (B)

OCTOBER 15: ZURICH - LAKE LUCERNE

OCTOBER 16: LAKE LUCERNE

Discover Lake Lucerne's unrivaled beauty on a walking tour that includes the spectacular medieval walls and towers dating back to the 13th century. (B)

OCTOBER 17: LAKE LUCERNE - BASEL-EMBARKATION

Check out of your hotel and visit the iconic Lion Monument, sculpted in memory of the Swiss Guards massacred during the French Revolution. Later, head to Basel. Upon arrival in Basel, enjoy a highlights tour of Switzerland's third-largest city. Long an important university, banking, and trade center, Basel's glorious past is still evident in its medieval Town Hall and exquisite 18th-century patrician homes. Then, enjoy free time for lunch on your own before the drive to the ship. (B, D)

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OCTOBER 16: DEPART THE USA

OCTOBER 17: ARRIVE IN ZURICH - EMBARKATION IN BASEL

Arrive in Zurich today and enjoy a brief city tour and talk about the Reformation in Switzerland before transferring to Basel. Embark on the ship this afternoon. Tonight, gather on board and meet your fellow passengers. (D)

OCTOBER 18: BREISACH

Breisach is your gateway to several different excursions, depending on your interests. Step back in time with a visit to the enchanting Alsatian town of Riquewihr, which looks almost the same as it did in the 16th century. On your walking tour, admire historic architecture as well as famous sights such as the Dolder Gate. Alternatively, you may wish to go to Freiburg, founded in 1120 and home to Freiburg's Münster, a Gothic cathedral said to have "the most beautiful spire on earth." Those wishing a more active excursion can cycle through the scenic countryside or go to the Black Forest, a magical land full of cultural traditions. (B, L, D)

OCTOBER 19: STRASBOURG

Strasbourg, the capital city of Alsace, offers flavors of both France and Germany because of its borderline location. Enjoy a panoramic tour past the stunning Parc de l'Orangerie, the European Parliament and the Place de la République. Then, walk through its iconic UNESCO World Heritage "La Petite France" district, which appears to have been lifted straight from the pages of a fairytale. Wander through these charming streets and past the Cathédrale de Nôtre Dame with its famous astronomical clock. For the active adventurer, you can take a guided bike ride through this captivating city and Parc de l'Orangerie. (B, L, D)

OCTOBER 20: LUDWIGSHAFEN - RÜDESHEIM

Ludwigshafen is your gateway to a choice of three excursions. Visit Heidelberg, the perfectly preserved medieval city nestled in the Neckar River Valley along Germany's Castle Road. Discover the iconic red sandstone Heidelberg Castle and Great Vat, an 18th-century 49,000-gallon wine cask. For a more active adventure while in Heidelberg, join a guided hike up the Philosopher's Path, aptly named during the Romantic Period, and be rewarded with panoramic views of the city. Or ride along the river Neckar to the medieval town of Ladenburg, where you'll have some free time to explore the shops and quaint Marktplatz. Alternatively, you can visit one of Germany's oldest cities, Speyer, known for the largest Romanesque cathedral in Europe, a UNESCO World Heritage Site, and the medieval Altpörtel, Old Gate. Later in the day, sail to Rüdesheim, where you can visit Siegfried's Mechanical Musical Instrument Museum or taste one of the town's special delights, Rüdesheimer Coffee, ceremoniously made with brandy. (B, L, D)

OCTOBER 21: RÜDESHEIM – RHINE GORGE - LAHNSTEIN

Your exploration of Rüdesheim continues with your choice of three excursions. Take a gondola ride to the Niederwalddenkmal Statue, where you can enjoy panoramic views of the river. Afterward, indulge your taste buds with a sampling of Riesling wines in the vineyards. If you prefer a more active adventure, hike through Rüdesheim's vineyards, taking in views of the town, the Roman Bridge and Bromersburg Castle. Or join a guided bike ride through the town and along the Rhine River. During the afternoon, set sail along the scenic Rhine River Gorge with its fabled legends and many castles to Lahnstein, where you'll enjoy a visit to Lahneck Castle. (B, L, D)

OCTOBER 22: COLOGNE

Home to one of Germany's most revered Gothic masterpieces, the Cologne Cathedral, this 2,000-year-old city is also a bustling cosmopolitan hotspot. Join a guided tour through the enchanting Old Town and explore the UNESCO-designated cathedral, where the remains of the fabled Three Kings, the Magi, are believed to rest. Alternatively, ride a bike along the Rhine and through the historic Stadtgarten, or visit a local tavern to taste Kölsch beer and Reibekuchen, potato pancakes served with apple sauce. (B, L, D)

OCTOBER 23: AMSTERDAM

Amsterdam boasts amazing history, art, architecture, and museums, and you have a choice as to how you wish to explore it. The famous canals of Amsterdam await discovery on your city tour, beginning with a scenic canal cruise. If you prefer exploring the world with your taste buds, stroll past traditional canals, gabled houses, narrow bridges, and houseboats to taste Dutch specialties at a grand Amsterdam café. (B, L, D)

Similarly without limiting the foregoing, passenger agrees to hold us harmless for any defect in any vehicle, plane, boat, bus, car, van or other vehicle, act of war or insurrection, terrorist activity, revolt or other civil uprising, military action, strikes or labor unrest or any Act of God or for any other act of any third party.
